



# Royal Marienbad Golf Club

The Marienbad golf course opened on 21 August 1905 at the presence of HRH King Edward VII. In February 2003, HRH Queen Elizabeth II granted permission to the club to use the title of Royal. On 18 July 2005, within the celebrations of the 100th anniversary of the Royal Golf Club at Mariánské Lázně, HRH Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex visited Mariánské Lázně and the course.



# The Old Course – Est. 1905

The Old Course PAR 72 is a parkland course on the border of a natural reserve, 700m above sea level. Holes are separated with fully grown trees, with greens preserved in original size and shape.



The club welcomes guests to the renovated historic clubhouse, featuring restaurant, bar, summer terrace, changing rooms, caddy hall, driving range with 36 tees, 2 approach and 2 putting greens, 9 hole PAR 3 course, winter practice facilities, full-swing simulator, professional golf school, fully equipped Pro shop, equipment and trolleys for hire. We closely cooperate with 5 championship courses within 50 min. driving distance.


The oldest golf course in Central Europe



The Old Course hosted numerous Czechoslovak and Czech National Championships, PGA European Tour Events, European Junior and Senior Amateur Team Championships and R&A St Andrews & Jacques Leglise Trophy.



Holes No. 2 and 12 share two half-way refreshment points, one of which is also available for the 5th hole, shared with a public Pitch & Putt course. Natural water spring available behind Green No. 7.
